Breaking News

UBC DEM Strategic Initiative

In September of 2013, the Mass Gathering Medicine Interest Group {MGMIG} was granted status as an official <u>strategic initiative</u> within the Department of Emergency Medicine {DEM} at the University of British Columbia {UBC}.

International Collaborations

International collaborations are in the offing. Team members are engaged in conversations with the World Health Organization, as well as mass gathering researchers from Australia, Ireland, and Eastern Canada.

Drs. Adam Lund & Sheila Turris will be travelling to Australia in December as "visiting scholars" to continue work on mass gatherings and community health. Specifically they will be leading a collaboration on a consensus to build a "data framework" for mass gatherings research at the request of the World Health Organization's (WHO)

Collaborating Centre lead in Flinders Australia, which will then be vetted by the WHO's Advisory Group on Mass Gatherings (which we are members of).

The outcome of this meeting will be a "Green Paper", and a process to gather international input. The long game will be to collate that international input through 2014, and then present a draft of a "White Paper" at the World Congress on Disaster and Emergency Medicine in 2015.

3. Grant applications – After some early successes with small grants from MITACS, UBC, and Vancouver Coastal Health, in the fall of 2012 the MGMIG submitted a first-time grant application to the Canadian Institutes of Health Research (CIHR). The purpose was to study the impact of special events on local health services, as well as the creation of a predictive model for patient presentations in the context of specific types of events. As is so often the case, our first application was not successful and we will be resubmitting the grant application in the early spring of 2014. As well, two members of our research team are collaborating with the MG group in Australia on an Australian Council Research grant with the decision pending.
